Dear Members;

Greetings to all in this the fourth newsletter for this year. It is hoped everyone is enjoying this holiday season. And we want to welcome back our members who escaped the hot Florida summer for the cooler north. I'll be updating you on recent activities of the Club and informing you of upcoming events.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL: 1982 is just around the corner and it is time to remind everyone that it is DUES time again, which are \$8.00 per year for Regular Members and \$4.00 for Junior Members (age 12-17) for the next year. The Club By-Laws require dues to be paid by April 1st. However, it is hoped that dues will be received before that deadline so the Club can budget its expenses early in the year, and also so that a member will not become delinquent as an active member.

Many of you will be paying directly to the Treasurer at one of the next meetings. But, since many members, for whatever reason, may not be attending an early meeting next year, a pre-addressed envelope is enclosed if you wish to mail in a check.

JANUARY MEETINGS: The first meeting in January will be on thursday, January 7th. At this meeting the Nominating Committee will present its Report of Nominations for Club Officers to be elected on January 21st for the upcoming two years.

Also on the program will be the awards presentation for exhibitors in SUNPEX '81. If you exhibited please try to make a special effort to be present at this meeting. Following this will be a regular philatelic program by a speaker. The complete 1982 Program is not finalized as yet but an interesting program is promised.

Our second meeting in January(Jan 21) is the Annual Meeting of the Membership(including Treasurer and Secretary reports), to be followed by sell, swap, trade session. As I've mentioned previously, the By-Laws of the Club require this annual meeting in January. The most important part of this meeting this year will be the election of the new Club offcers for the 1982-1983 term. This is an important meeting for the Membership. The meeting is open for general discussion about the Club, and the members are invited and encouraged to offer suggestions and recommendations for programs and activities, or just to ask any questions about the organization and functioning of the Club.

It is a pleasure to announce that 16 new members have joined the Club this year bringing our total active membership to 88. A revised membership roster will be published and available at the January 21st meeting, incorporating all new members since January, 1981.

MEMBERSHIP ROSTER: It is recognized that many members would prefer not to have addresses and telephone numbers published on a roster. At the last Board of Directors meeting in October the entire subject of the feasibility of publishing an annual member roster was discussed at length. Pros and cons were thoroughly considered. Without going into great length, it was approved that an annual roster would continue to be published. However, there will be modifications henceforth. First, a roster of all members' names and collecting interest will continue as is presently done. However, with regard to address and telephone number, it was approved that any member may have either or both deleted from the roster. But the Secretary will continue to maintain one master roster with all names, addresses, and telephone numbers, for the obvious reason of mailing correspondence, telephone contact if necessary, and for Club historical records.

Therefore, it is requested that each member consider one of the following options for the new roster:

- 1. Retain both address and telephone number, as is.
- 2. Delete both address and telephone number.
- 3. Retain address and delete telephone number.
- 4. Delete address and retain telephone number.
- 5. Substitute Post Office Box for other mailing address, if you have a P.O. Box.

The new roster will be published and available for the Annual Meeting on January 21st. Therefore, the Secretary must have your decision no later than January 15, 1982.

Please advise me either: at the first meeting in January (Jan 7); or please use the pre-addressed envelope with a note inside. (postal cards not recommended). If no response is received by January 15, it will be assumed no change is desired.

If you have had a recent change of address, ZIP code, or telephone number, I would like to be advised in order to keep the master roster current.

Remember - No later than January 15, 1982, please.

SUNPEX '81: The exhibition and bourse was held on December 5th and 6th, From all indications it was extremely successful and enjoyable. So many Club members contributed their time and efforts to setting up the bourse, preparing exhibits, and handling Club Table duties, there is not enough space to thank each one individually. One last item. For those of you who might be interested, the door prize, a \$5.00 Hamilton, donated by Michael Rogers, was won by Dr. Verner Bohne, who, I'm sure many of you remember gave a talk to the Club a few months ago on Fakes, Forgeries, and Altered Stamps.

We also will have a voluntary exchange of Christmas philatelic gifts, of a nominal value, on the same basis as in past years, one-for-one. If you bring one, you receive one.


Family members are invited to attend and are welcome. The party committee has been working hard these past weeks and a fine evening is guaranteed. So, Come One, Come All.
