Dear Members,

This is our second letter to you this year. Many events are to occur between now and the end of this year and we want to advise all of you of those events, changes in the program, and other matters of importance to the members of the Central Florida Stamp Club, Inc.

The next meeting, Thursday, September 6, 1984, is our THIRD FIRST. auction of the year. Basically, the general auctions are limited to 60 lots, with a limit of 5 lots per member, due to time necessary to view the lots, calling of the auction, balancing the books, taking in payments for material sold, and payments to the owners. HOWEVER, a CLUB DONATION LOT, or LOTS, will be accepted in addition to the 60 lots noted. Remember, Thursday, September 6.

SECOND. Program Change. The meeting "Ask the Experts", scheduled for October 4, 1984, has been changed. On that night WE WILL NOT MEET IN THE ORLANDO SCIENCE CENTER. The program has been changed to a visit to the U.S. Postal Service Orlando Sectional Center and a guided tour of that facility to view the inner workings of how OUR mail is processed. The guided tour will commence at 7:30 P.M., Thursday, October 4, 1984, AT THE ORLANDO POSTAL SERVICE SECTIONAL CENTER, 10401 TRADEPORT ROAD, Orlando. Please note the change in time. The possibility exists that the Club may have the use of a School Bus that evening and we will be able to meet in the Science Center Parking Lot and board the bus for the trip to and return from the Orlando Sectional Center. The bus will depart the Science Center parking lot not later than 7:00 P.M. I emphasize that this arrangement is not firm as of date of preparing this letter, and you will have to either attend the September meetings, or call one of the Officers, for the latest information on the bus. However, for those who wish to travel by their own car, the Orlando Sectional Center is located at 10401 TRADEPORT ROAD (Formerly Florida Road), and runs in a southerly direction along the western side of the Orlando Jet Port. It is easily reached by driving to McCoy Road and then EAST on McCoy Road to the underpass in front of the Days Inn and thence up the ramp onto the Bee Line continuing EAST to the TRADEPORT ROAD exit, thence SOUTH on Tradeport Road to the last building on the left side of the road, which is the Post Office and Sectional Center. For those who may come down Semoran Boulevard (SR 436) exit right (WEST) onto the Bee Line Expressway and continue WEST to the TRADEPORT ROAD exit, then south to the Post Office. For those coming down 436 there is a "sneaky detour" around the toll gate which will avoid paying the toll, but I do not know how to make that "sneaky detour", as I simply do not go to the Airport via 436. There is ample free parking at the Post Office.

THIRD. OUR Annual Club Show, SUNPEX 184, will be held on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, November 30, December 1 and December 2, 1984, at the Orlando EXPO CENTER (across the street from the Bob Carr Auditorium). This is a new location this year. There will be a large bourse, and HOPEFULLY a 100-frame Club Exhibition. We understand the Concessionaire will be open for the entire time of the show. Plenty of FREE parking across the street from the EXPO CENTER. There is no misteak in stating 100 Frame Exhibition (we did it at the first and second SUNPEX shows), but more on that in the next paragraph.

FOURTH. In 1983 the Club purchased 50 stamp exhibit frames (thanks to the generous donations by the members) holding 9 album pages per frame from

the Florida Federation of Stamp Clubs so that we could become more self-sufficient for our annual club exhibition. This year we had the opportunity to acquire an additional 60 frames (for a total of 110 frames) and took advantage of that situation. WE SEEK YOUR HELP!! It has been suggested that if any member wishes to voluntarily donate a frame, or frames, to the club, it (they) would be most graciously accepted. The price this year is \$11.00 per frame. The donated frame will become the property of the Central Florida Stamp Club, Inc., and a small brass plate will be placed on each donated frame with the inscription: "Frame Donated by (name) ". Thus, we have now become frame self-sufficient for a bang up club show. We have had those in the past; there is no reason why we cannot continue that tradition. It is now time to plan your exhibit. Basic information is that each frame will hold nine "standard" album pages. A standard album page is $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" in size, up to 12" x 12" (with a little overlapping of the binding edge). In other words, 9 pages require 1 frame; 18 pages 2 frames; etc. You want to exhibit? Simple! What do you collect? Topics are as varied as what is collected. Anything from a topical, to postal history, to postal cards, to fancy cancels; to an exhibit of specialized Penny Blacks or Zepplin covers, or the U.S. 1¢ 1851 issue. Use minimal ornamentation. The philatelic items are the super stars. Use brief titles and headings. Be brief but thorough in "writing up". Let the philatelic items do the talking. Ask questions at the Club Meetings on any aspect of putting together an exhibit. Above all, remember this is a CLUB SHOW. We will be publishing a newsletter on the show in the future and will include more details.

FIFTH. Holiday Party, Thursday, December 20, 1984. Once again our most gracious Treasurer, Mrs. Jane C. Morrison, has very generously offered the use of her home for this event. Calls will be made for HELP and ASSISTANCE. This is a NO GIFT party; however, we hope that everyone will bring their usual and outstanding gourmet delights to ticklet the palates. The Club will provide the main course and the coffee (or tea). Thus, there will be no meeting held on Thursday, December 20, 1984, at the Orlando Science Center. More on the Holiday Party in the next newsletter.

SIXTH. Due to remodelling of the Mount Vernon Motor Lodge, and most specifically the converting into a dining room of the area used by the Central Florida Stamp Dealers for their quarterly Bourse, that activity has been moved to the Sheraton Inn Winter Park, 736 Lee Road, directly across the street from the Howard Johnson Convention Center on Lee Road (at I-4). The members will receive by mail a flyer concerning the next bourse.

I am attaching a sheet, and am enclosing an addressed envelope for your convenience in returning to us, in which we ask if you would like to donate one or more of the new frames to the Club (\$11.00 each); if you would be interested in exhibiting at the Club Show on November 30 - December 2; if you would be willing to serve on the Exhibit Committee to set up the show; if you would be willing to be appointed as Exhibit Chairman or as Assistant Exhibit Chairman; and if you would volunteer to work at the Club Table during the show. Please return at an early date or give to us at the meeting.
