Fellow members,

This is our second letter of 1986.

There are many members who have not paid their 1986 dues at this late date. If you are one of those members, we have included a self-addressed envelope with this letter = please send your check to us immediately (Dues for 1986 are \$10.00).

Our next meeting on September 18, 1986, is the fourth auction of the year. We request those who will enter lots (3 lots maximum per member until we reach a maximum of 60 lots - Club Donation Lots accepted above that number) to please get them in early so we can get the auction underway promptly at 8:00 P.M. and be finished by 10:00 P.M. The Night Manager has requested that we leave by then!

PLEASE NOTE that on September 18, 1986, the main entrance to the Orlando Science Center will be LOCKED due to installation of new carpeting. Attendees will have to enter the building through the door at the Pendulum to the north of the Main Entrance.

There has been some mis-understanding about the FLOREX Stamp Exhibition that will be held at the Orlando Expo Centre, 500 West Livingston Street, Orlando, Florida, on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, October 31, November 1 and 2, 1986. This show IS NOT SPONSORED by the Central Florida Stamp Club, Inc. Rather, the FLOREX is the Fall Meeting of the Florida Federation of Stamp Clubs, Inc. and is sponsored by that organization. HOWEVER, as this show is being held in the area of the Central Florida Stamp Club, Inc., and as our Club is a CHARTER MEMBER of the Federation (dating back to 1950) it falls on us to assist the Federation in every way to make this show a success. There will be a 50-dealer bourse, and an approximate 300 frame (16 pages) exhibition. The Germany Philatelic Society will be holding its annual convention in connection with this show. The FLOREX show is an American Philatelic Society accredited Champion of Champions show (which means that the GRAND AWARD winner at this competition will be invited to participate in the 1987 World Series of Philately).

Member Phil Fettig is the General Chairman of FLOREX '86; Vice President A. Stephen Patrick is in charge of providing the Special Cachet envelopes for the show as well as getting the FLOREX Special Cancel approved and issued by the U.S. Postal Service, as well as having a fine hand in getting a Temporary Postal Station established to serve you with the entire gamut of philatelic items available from the Postal Service. Member Calvin Fiala has volunteered to set up the exhibit and to take down the exhibit (the most thankless task in the show); and Member Jane C. Morrison has volunteered to Chair the Registration and Hospitality table(s).

These individuals are going to need a lot of help to accomplish all of the tasks associated with their areas of responsibility. It is the purpose of this letter to get VOLUNTEERS from amongst our members to do this ASSISTING.

Mr. Ron Yankowski of Clearwater, Chairman of the Youth Programs for FLOREX '86, has written to us as follows: "I would like each club to donate at least one shoe box of stamps for the youth table. It would be helpful to have foreign and U.S. material separated". We will have a shoe box at our meetings on

September 18, October 2 and October 18 to accept donations of stamps to send to Mr. Yankowski for the Youth Program.


The help that is needed is as follows:

A. EXHIBITION. Six teams of two (2) individuals to assist Mr. Fiala are needed to set up AND take down the exhibits. We have been assured by both Phil and Calvin that their sons, both strong and husky young men, will be in charge of unloading the frames from the truck(s), opening the self-contained storage/transportation cases and getting the frames from the unloading area to the Exhibit Area. At this point the Exhibit Chairman (Mr. Melvin Kessler, a Postal History Dealer from Fort Walton Beach) along with Mr. Fiala will have laid out the parameters of the exhibit area and the six teams of two individuals will be instructed how to operate and load the exhibit frames. The exhibit frames are made of aluminum and plexiglass, are of a security type (same type as used at AMERIPEX) and require two persons to insert the album pages, and after "loading", the frames must be securely locked using special tools. We also anticipate that some exhibitors will show up and want to mount their exhibits - those who show up are considered to be "volunteers" to assist in setting up the balance of the frames. The Exhibit will be set up on THURSDAY, late afternoon or early evening, October 30, 1986 - the exact hours will be provided later. The show will be broken down commencing at about 4:00 P.M. Sunday Afternoon, 2 November 1986. We will also need the same six teams to take down the show. Extreme care must be exercised in taking down the show to make certain that each exhibit is placed in its own shipping container, inventoried, etc., at they will have to be taken to the bank vault for storage and subsequent return to owners. Bill and I believe this will be the most tedious and most difficult task that we face. We assume that all who volunteer to help put up the show are also volunteering to help take down the show. (PLEASE STEP TO THE HEAD OF THE LINE)

B. REGISTRATION AND HOSPITALITY. We believe that this will consist of having each visitor sign in on either a form or in a "guest book"; be given a copy of the FLOREX '86 Program (as well as a floor plan of the Dealer Bourse and Exhibits); pass the FLOREX '86 Cachet Table and be offered the opportunity to purchase Cachets (this is one of the methods used to hopefully preclude having to charge an admission fee); talk with the Banquet representative (I do not have details other than it will be held on Saturday night, 1 November 1986, at the OMNI Hotel - adjacent to the EXPO CENTRE); receive a Central Florida Stamp Club, Inc. handout concerning our club; possibly picking up a Central Florida Visitors package (from the Central Florida Visitors Bureau); and other good things that will almost assuredly develop (a/k/a "Freebies"). We estimate that we will need three individuals to be at this group of tables during the hours of 10:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. on Friday and Saturday, October 31 and November 1, and from 10:00 A.M. until 4:00 P.M. on Sunday, November 2. There is also a possibility of having to do some work at the Federation Hospitality Suite in the Omni Hotel (the Official Hotel for FLOREX '86). If your spouse is "not really into stamp collecting", why not get him/her to come down and sit with you on this??? What we want to do here is to NOT MIX up the Banquet Ticket Money with the Cachet Sales Money, or any other monies. In-as-much as the Show Cachet has been addressed in this paragraph previously, there is no need to talk further on it here - except that the preliminary art work is most striking.

We enclose a form for YOU to complete advising us of what you would like to do at this show for the CLUB. Please return it to us at the earliest possible date so we can firm up all plans.
