Serendipitous Philately --Who Would Know? by Person

Who Would Know?, by Bruce Mc Pherson

In 1978 Sweden issued a stamp commemorating Dr. Fritz Haber, as part of their continuing series of Nobel Prize winners on postage stamps. The stamp designer included a building in the background that was supposed to be Dr. Habers laboratory building. In fact the laboratory was across the street from the building shown.

Dr. Hans Eisner, a professor at Cornel University, recognized the error and reported it to the Swedish postal authorities. Nothing could be done to change

the design since the stamp had been issued. It is interesting that Dr. Eisner was one of the few people in the world that would have noticed the error. His long interest in stamps as a collector, in addition to his close association with Dr. Haber, led to this little known philatelic fact.
