More on Norway & the US

In 1825 the Norwegian sloop "Restauration" set sail for the United States. This was the first organized emigration from Norway to the United States. This ship leg by Cleng Peerson landed in New York City after a three month voyage. The group settled in Kendel, New York. The centennial of this event was commemorated in 1925 with a United States postage stamp featuring the sloop "Restauration" (Scott #621)

In 1975, the sesquicentennial of the same event was honored by Norwegian postage showing Cleng Peerson and a portion of an American letter.
