

USPS —How About Recognizing These Guys? By Stuart B.

On 2006, U.S stamps were issued honoring Jonas Salk and Albert Sabin both of whom developed polio vaccines. However, none of this would have been possible without the ability to grow the polio virus in a test tube using tissue-culture methods.

This was developed by doctors, Thomas Weller, John Enders and Frederick Robbins. The three of them did receive the Nobel Prize for their work in 1954, but there has been no commemorative stamp. It has been said that Salk and Sabin ba-



sically stood on the shoulders of these three men.

Many of us remember the era of 1940's and 1950's when polio was much feared and poorly understood. Tens of thousands of new cases occurred yearly. The feared word was "infantile paralysis". Hospitals were filled with iron lungs and children were kept from public places in the Summer. What a wonderful thing that polio has practically been eliminated.

These three men, Weller, Enders and Robbins, did further research on other viral diseases and vaccines. All three of them have died; the last one, Dr. Weller, died in August 2008.

How about the club lobbying the United States Postal Service for a commemorative stamp or stamps honoring these three brilliant researchers?
