# Navy Ships named after Florida locations or landmarks By Phil F.


This will be the first of a short series on U.S. Navy Ships with names connected to Florida's cities, counties, geographical landmarks and the state itself. Six U.S. Navy ships (and one Confederate Raider) have been named after the state itself. The first three named USS FLORIDA served at various times from 1824 - 1885, and while they certainly carried mail,

they did not have a post office on-board. It is fitting to start off this series with the fourth USS FLOR-IDA who ended her days as the USS TALLAHAS-



SEE, thus cov-

ering two names! This USS FLORIDA (BM-9) served as a "Battle Monitor" (early Battleship) from 1903 - 1908.



Since post offices were established on Navy Ships in 1908, I am not sure if a cancel exists and have not seen one. In 1908, plans for a newer bigger Battleship to be named USS FLORIDA were announced and the older ship was re-named USS TALLAHASSEE (BM-9). The older FLORIDA/TALLAHASSEE served in various service jobs until scrapped in 1922. Figure (1) is a view of the ship prior to the name change. Figure (2) is a 1915 cancel of the USS TALLAHASSEE. These cancels are difficult to locate.
