

## The Fifth U.S. Navy Ship named USS FLORIDA

The fifth USS FLORIDA (BB-30) was a Battleship launched in 1910 and commissioned on September 15, 1911. She was 521 feet long and weighed 21, 285 tons. FLORIDA's early years were spent in training exercises and cruises, mainly around the Eastern U.S. Seaboard and the Caribbean Sea. In 1914, problems escalated between the United States and Mexico and the FLORIDA was one of the ships sent to take part in the occupation of Vera Cruz. After the United States entered into World War I in 1917, the FLORIDA was one of the Battleships sent to serve with the British Home Fleet. She performed convoy duty around the British Isles until the end of the war.

On November 18, 1918, FLORIDA was one of the Home Fleet ships that took part in escorting the surrendering German High Seas Fleet. Of interest to philatelists, FLORIDA took part in the Pilgrim Tercentenary Celebration in August 1920. In 1930, the London Naval Treaty dictated the reduction of Naval Forces in five major countries including the United States. As a result the USS FLORIDA (BB-30) was scrapped after being decommissioned in February 1931. Figure (1) is a post card view of the USS FLORIDA. Figure (2) shows a Flag Cancel from the FLORIDA. Note that the cover is addressed to W. G. Crosby, creator of the Crosby Cachets with small photos on First Day and Naval Covers,


