More letters home during World War II, this time from Orlando, FL!


Recently my article illustrated a postcard and cancel from the Orlando Air Base. This article features two letters from Sgt. Arthur Novotny to his parents in Rochester, MN. Sgt. Novotny was attached to the Headquarters Squadron of the Army Air Forces School of Applied Tactics, a major training command. Initially it was housed on the Orlando Base, but outgrew the space.

Figure (1) shows the letterhead stationery that was used. It shows a view of the Fountain at Lake Eola. Note that Orlando's nickname was "The City Beautiful".

Both letters are full of routine family comments and references. Of interest to us are his comments in the October 1943 letter stating "We are all settled here at the fairgrounds now and I don't like the place at all but I think that after a few days here it won't seem to bad. We were to accustomed to the comforts of the base...we just have to do all our usual crabbing just to show that we are becoming regular solders."

A few months later in January, 1943 Sgt. Novotny jokes his parents about their 31 degree below weather at home. He states "I get cold here when the temperature drops below 50". He also comments "You should here [sic] the Natives moan about losing the tourist trade. Yet the Army spends twice as much." So you see, the more things change, the more they stay the same.

The training work started by the military in early World War II continues today with the Army and Navy having a major presence in the UCF area working on Simulation and Training Technology.
