Did You Read This Far — Answer

The answer to the question that was posed in the July newsletter was — the change to the Gregorian Calendar caused the confusion in the year of birth for Ben Franklin. Dates adjusted by 1 year and 11 days. His dates of birth and death are recorded as; **Benjamin Franklin** January 17, 1706 [O.S. January 6, 1705] — April 17, 1790. The initials O.S. representing "Old Style" (or the Julian Calendar) before the conversion. The change over happened, in the British Empire and the U.S. in 1752. What is in a Color?

So many of the finer points in the endeavor called philately — turn on what one would think are minor considerations. Often times those minor considerations mean a huge difference in value. [I do realize these pic-



tures in black/white are almost useless — take a gander at them on the website in full color.] At the left the first two columns are the very common booklet pane of 634d (carmine) which has a never hinged price of \$2.50. The column to the right is showing only one half of the booklet of 634e (carmine lake) which has a never hinged price of \$1,000.

Can you tell the difference? After years of being shunned from having a catalog listing, in recent years the uncommon color varieties are now gaining acceptance — often with eye-popping prices assigned.

This stamp, as most any that is considered a color error, should only be purchased with a solid certificate to back it up.

Another of my favorite color varieties is the 30 cent Prexy error. The common deep ultramarine stamp #830 has a catalog value of \$4.00. Now things get interesting — 830a (blue) is valued at \$15 and 830b (deep blue) is valued at \$240! The

deep blue variety can be found in the middle of the bottom row laying on top of the block of 6 of the common deep ultramarine variety. It is very distinctive — when you know what to look for.

You may ask — Why collect color varieties? I am extremely fond of US Classic material and have achieved a level of completeness that involves only adding one or two items a year, as the cost of acquisition is so high. Color varieties allow me to continue to collect, add to my holdings and maintain a level of interest that I still find addictive.

If you have not been there — you will some day!
