






## **Something New In the Wind!**



## Minor Stuff That Makes One Happy! By the Editor

Collecting “stuff” can often take one in directions not expected. For the last 8 years the Edison series 654-655-656 has been of special interest to me. This item turned up on eBay a month ago and immediately caught my attention. The production total of 133 million of this stamp should have resulted in a nice selection of EFO material — wrong! This is the first oddity I have ever seen of this coil stamp. The sixth hole from the top (center of the pair) is missing. This is not a blind perforation. To be real, it is a minor oddity, that resulted from a broken perforation pin that caused one perforation to be missed.
