

The Presidents Message by A. Stephen Patrick

I collect souvenir cards. For those who don't know what that is, they are reproductions on card stock of stamps, paper money, and vignettes produced by the Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP) and the American Bank Note Co. (ABN), now out of business. Our club makes a colorful souvenir card for FLOREX, but the BEP and ABN were able to re-use the original engraved plates from their archives to re-print classic designs from the past.

In 25 years I have never been able to convert any Central Florida Stamp Club member to join the Souvenir Card Collectors Society. This should perhaps discourage me, but it doesn't. I used to sell a few extra cards to Bill Bomar Jr., but he moved away. From time to time I show new issues at the club, but no one has ever lit up and said, "Wow, where can I get me some of these? My message continues to be, "Collect what you like to collect."

We have many specialists in the club. I love Robert Fisher and his dedication to Central Europe and the German area. That is about all he collects, but he is still interested to learn what others are doing. He facilitates presentations technically and has become a key volunteer as our exhibits chair at FLOREX and SUNPEX. I hope that even if you are a specialist that you still can find knowledge and fellowship at the club.

My second message is, "You don't have to be rich to collect stamps." One of our loyal members is Roy Anderson. He has a tremendous worldwide and U.S. collection, but it is primarily used stamps. He buys lots of inexpensive kiloware at club auctions, because he has trading partners in Europe who trade him hundreds of stamps for just the cost of postage. Mint never hinged condition is costly, and some can't afford it, especially the kids. But after all, most of us would never turn down the gift of a used penny black.

Although it's the summer doldrums, I hope you find some way to keep the fireworks coming in your hobby.


