

This last year I gave a program on philatelic places that I recently visited. In 2012 I revisited Mt. Vernon, the Hermitage, the Williamsburg City Court House, and went to Gunston Hall and Gadsby's Tavern for the first time, all subjects on U.S. postage stamps.

On my recent vacation, we sailed into Charlotte Amalie on the cruise ship. Immediately, the 1937 purple commemorative for the Virgin Islands filled my mind. I already knew this place from my stamp collection. As my tour vehicle climbed the mountain, my camera captured the same harbor scene except that instead of two older sailing ships in the harbor, it was the Carnival Breeze and Liberty.



In high school I visited Monterrey, Mexico, with my Spanish class. We were taken to the modern new cathedral with statues of the 12 apostles in line over the front doors. No one in my class had seen it before, but I recognized it from a 30 centavo stamp in my collection. The same déjà vu came with the Lief Ericsson statue at the Mariner's Museum in Hampton Roads, the kneeling slave before Lincoln statue at Tuskegee Institute, and the marble shaft at the Huguenot Memorial near Ft. Caroline at Jacksonville.

Someday, I may visit the Devil's Tower, Old Faithful, and even Mt. Rushmore, but I'm already an expert through postage stamps (even the muddy brown variety). Most stamp collectors know what I mean.

I'm sure we are all anticipating FLOREX next month with 50 dealers, great exhibits, a Rogers auction and chances to add more examples of places we have visited or wish to visit in our philatelic dreams. Thanks to all the club volunteers that will make it a success.


