

## The Travels of an Air Post Cover by Phil Fettig

received the first flight cachet and departed at 8:30am on January 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1929.

Pilot Harry Rogers flew from Miami and landed in Nassau where the cover received a back-stamp, **Figure 2**. Mr. Roberts had modified the return instructions in the upper left corner by crossing out "in one week" and adding in "immediately". However, the American Air Mail Catalog indicates 28 pounds of mail was carried on this initial flight, so it is doubtful that Pilot Rogers waited around for this to be processed before he made the inaugural return flight.

After this we can only speculate that Mr. Roberts did not pick up the cover and it was returned without any further postmarks. The cover was franked with the correct seven cents for a half ounce, although some covers are found with only five cents as an unofficial announcement had reduced the cost in December.

I thought this cover might make an interesting note before it "flew" out my stock. A common practice by cover collectors was to mail it addressed to yourself at "General Delivery" at a selected site and wait for it to be returned since you were not there to pick it up.

**Figure 1** is such a cover sent from Madison, NJ to catch a First Flight on U.S. Foreign Contract Air Mail Route No. 7-1 (FAM 7-1) Miami, FL to Nassau, Bahamas. The cover left Madison at 9pm on December 26, 1928 and arrived in Miami at 4:30pm on the 30<sup>th</sup>. It




