

Dealing with Guests by Robert Dowrick

When we have guests that are looking to sell their stamps or collections, we should follow a few simple rules that will protect both the guests as well as our members. First, if the guest wants to sell all of their collection as one unit, don't ask how much they will take for a portion of it. It is not fair to cherry-pick the best material and leave the rest. Secondly, if they are willing to sell their material in pieces, make an offer; don't ask them how much.

Most of the guests have no real idea the value of their material and it would not be fair to offer a price way below the fair value. And lastly, if the material is to be sold as a whole, please don't ask what others have offered or what they are willing to take. Present them with an offer on a piece of paper. This is fair to the owner as well as the other club members that may have placed a bid prior.




Serendipity — Part VI by the Editor

Selective Service — April 25, 1944

I was digging around in a dollar box of covers at FLOREX and stumbled across this piece of WWII history. The level of apprehension that was caused by receiving this post card can only be guessed at. Coalville is located about 45 miles outside of Salt Lake City to the northeast. The town had a population in 2000 of 1,382 and is situated at 5,500 feet above sea level. One has to wonder how small Coalville was when this postcard was mailed in 1944. The town was founded in 1859 and was originally known as Chalk Creek. A brief internet search turned up the following information from the census of 1940: Parents Ernest & Bertha Lange. Three brothers in the household Charles (18), John (14) & Lawrence (11).

No further information can be found regarding John David Lange.

Mr. Lange: your son John Daniel Lange is only being called for a pre induction examination. He will be allowed to finish his senior year this year & not inducted before June.
