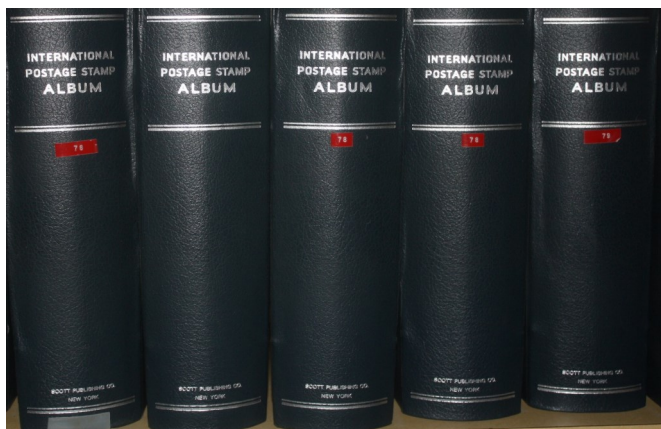

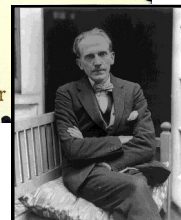
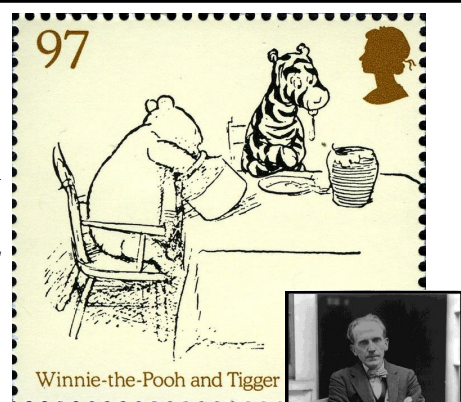
Are You Able to Help?

Serendipity — Part VII by the Editor

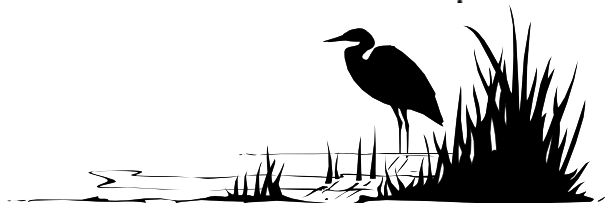
At FLOREX 2014, I was digging through a dealer's stock and pulled this out. How rarely does one see high value stamps (\$9.91) used correctly on an envelope? Dale Enterprises Inc. was owned by Dale Hendricks and it appears after doing a couple of web searches that this envelope from January of 2004 was used to send philatelic material to the buyer who lived in Villanova, PA. Dale Hendricks was a member of the ASDA since 1971 and a board member for 8 years, he passed away in February of 2010; he was nearly 80 years of age. Hendricks was active in the mail sale auction scene during the 1970s until possibly as late as the middle 2000s. Unfortunately, there is little online evidence to add to this story.
