

Stump(er) Contest Results



Random Thoughts This Month

I have to say this blank space is mocking me this month. Maybe something will bubble to the top tomorrow....

And here I go with two random thoughts.

Recently I was made aware that someone whom I have known for 43 years is also a stamp collector. Full disclosure — the person is a high school chum and I have not seen him in the flesh since graduation in June of 1977. Scott Bryne and I reconnected via social media (Facebook if you must know) 4 years ago and have maintained a casual communication channel ever since. Scott has collected United Nations, Pitcairn Islands and Darwin topicals. If we can work out the details Scott will meet me at the National Postal Museum in early October when we visit the area. To say I am looking forward to seeing my friend from all those years ago, would be an understatement! Are there folks in your life who you found out — years after first meeting them, that they were also collectors? I find it odd that something that is so much a part of a person is not more on display.

What acquisition in your philatelic life would make you giddy with excitement? I will call this my “philatelic hit-list” for lack of a better phrase. I have three. (1) The final plate block of #655, LR, #19807 — to complete that part of the collection. I have never seen one. (2) A 1922 pre-first edition of the Scott’s Specialized Catalog. With only 400 made (60 pages, bound in green leather), this is a very rare item from 94 years ago. Again I have never seen one. (3) This is actually a two part desire, a 30¢ and 50¢ Transport commercial or private use that is purely a domestic usage— not FDC, foreign or territorial. I own one of the 50¢ covers, but would love to own a couple more. We are collectors because the thrill of the hunt and acquisition is what makes us tick. So what are you searching for that has eluded you for years (or decades)?


