




Serendipity — Part XXIII by The Editor

This odd little cover was unearthed at the recent show held September 10-11 compliments of A & B Stamps. I showed this cover to about a dozen folks and everyone turned the cover over to find the rest of the address. What you see on the front is all there is. The sender/receiver are both from Winter Park. Obviously the postman knew the addressee and delivered it despite the lack of a complete address. I would expect this kind of service for 1969 — I am not at all confident that the year 2016 would find this cover deliverable. More than likely it would be returned to the sender as undeliverable.

Doing a brief world wide web search shows that Ray Allen Trovillion was born 05.14.1892 and passed away 12.12.1984 and was interred at Palm Cemetery in Winter Park. The sender I will assume was Ray Allen's wife Pearl Proctor Trovillion, born in Marion County, and a graduate of Florida State College for Women (now




Florida State University) who was 93 at the time of her passing in 1993. Ray Allen and Pearl married in 1922. Pearl was well known for her love of local history and did a lot to preserve records for future generations. She was also the mother of former Winter Park Mayor Allen Trovillion (born 1926). Allen served as the Mayor from 1962 to 1967 and then went on to the Florida House of Representatives.

The family name of Trovillion has a long history in Central Florida.
