

Club Shirts Now Available



Pretty Cover

I found this little cover stashed in a dollar box at a show some years ago. I bought it simply because I thought it was pretty. The use of two Washington/Franklin stamps plus the purple Registered marking makes for an attractive looking cover. Someone wrote the wrong Scott number on the cover next to the 10 cent yellow stamp. Don't do this — it is not necessary — if you must — write it on the back in light pencil. McComb, MS, where this cover originated from, was founded in 1872, is located 89 miles south of the destination of Jackson, MS. The population in 2010 was 12,790. No evidence on the WWW can be found for the sender or receiver. McComb was the scene of many acts of violence from the early decades of the 1900s until well into the 1960s. The only other claim to history, is the fatal crash in 1977 of the plane carrying members of the Lynard Skynyrd Band that occurred in a nearby swamp. One has to wonder what was so important as to warrant the expenditure of 12 cents to get news sent 89 miles. If only this cover could speak.....



Using an online resource, 12 cents in 1915, equates to \$2.87 in 2017!
