


"As one of the oldest members of the CFSC (DoB, 02.23.1923) I thought you might be interested to know I began collecting stamps in 1950 with an interruption during the later years of the 1900s and resuming in 2011. My interests covered world-wide mint and used, especially U.S. mint never hinged, O.G., singles, plate blocks, air mail and covers. Also United Nations with an interruption from 1975-1989, resuming in 1989 to 1992, used and mint. Over the years I've accumulated enough stamps (sheets) to begin a business :). I'm a natural born collector. Especially if it's any kind of a stamp — I collect it."



Those Troublesome W/F Watermarks

Yes — I am talking about the Washington/Franklin series. The "art" of watermarking is by no means easy. It takes a lot of practice and seeing what really happens. If you have an active imagination you will have major issues with watermarks. Rarely do you find a complete full letter watermark — most times it is a fragment of a letter that can be obscured by cancelling ink or even thins in the paper.




This image shows a full letter "S" that extends about 60% into the margin paper. That would leave about 40% of a single line "S" to try and find. The thin vertical black line that I drew represents about where the cut place would be. The real challenge on this particular stamp is — there is no other part of a letter to be found. Now imagine what it would look like if that edge was cut real close or into the stamp. Things get difficult real fast. I would like to think I would recognize it for what it is — if the margin paper was gone, but a lot of the times it is pure luck. Simply put, you can't invent what is not there!
