

We ask everyone to be aware of what can be unearthed in old collections that have not seen the light of day in many decades. Gems can be found in those old musty albums and boxes. Just look. You might get a real surprise!

### **Serendipity — XXXIV by The Editor**

This cover (dated Feb 25, 1932) acknowledging the 22<sup>nd</sup> Consecutive Central Florida Exposition, came out of hiding a couple of months ago. So what is it? Well — it is a piece of Central Florida history to be certain. While the name of the annual event has altered some over the years — The Central Florida Fair has been an ongoing event since 1910, when it was located in the heart of downtown Orlando. According to an article in the Orlando Sentinel from April 27, 2008 by Joy Wallace Dickinson; "The roots of the fair reach back to the 1880s and winter expositions on the shores of Lake Eola, but the current count of years begins in the 20th century." The yearly event took place just west of present day I4 in the area of Central Ave. Sometime in the 1960s the property at Bennett Park on west Colonial was purchased and has been used ever since.

So what is the connection between the CFSC and the Central Florida Fair? For a number of years starting in the late 1990s the CFSC staffed a community outreach booth for the entire run of the Fair — all ten days. One can find covers created by the CFSC to acknowledge the fair. The involvement of the CFSC was ended as the diminishing returns seen made the event less than desirable considering all the hours required. With 1, 2 or 3 members of the CFSC staffing the booth during busy times — and not so busy times, the total of nearly 200 hours of service often was seen to support the event. The many hours that I staffed the booth are some of the most interesting philatelic outreach I have ever participated in — and some of the most dull! The history is out there — look for it.
