

Writers Needed....Like Always



History Found.....

Things turn up in strange ways. This cover was handed to me by a fellow member of the CFSC recently. Stan Brodersen had found it while exploring a box of philatelic driftwood. While this is not the oldest hard evidence of the CFSC it is certainly a pretty cover! There are no extra markings on the back of the cover, or any information as to the illustrator. I find it interesting to note the selection of the 3 cent green stamp commemorating the statehood of Nevada. It was a curious selection until the big tree on the left side of the stamp came into focus — which seems to play off the tree noted in the cover cachet. With no sending address this cover

was either a handback courtesy service or it was enclosed in a mailing envelope to protect it.

My guess is —handback service of which the philatelic friendly staff at the Christmas Post Office was well known for.

How many other pieces of our history are waiting to be found?

Time will tell!
