There is an interesting mix of postage covering nearly 80 years of issuance and six different types of classes. There is only one small problem. The postage cost for a certified letter mailed November of 2017 was \$4.26 – of that total paid with the use of stamps – a full \$1.00 was "paid" with invalid postage. The fact that the letter has a printed label for \$0.00 tell us that the envelope was presented to a clerk – which had to be for the Certified Mail use. The clerk did not catch the fact that the Special Delivery and Certified Mail stamps have no monetary value. Don't be fooled into using Special Delivery stamps – they have NOT been valid for any other use other than Special Delivery and since that type of service is no longer available – the stamps have zero monetary value.

This mailing at the very least should not have been accepted -- and in reality, should have been docked for \$1.00 in postage due.

Duyane Alan 'Dewey' Hoffman February 24, 1920 – October 30, 2019 (Died @ age 99 years - 4 months shy of 100 years) Apopka, FL survived by his wife Nancy.

Transferring back to N.Y., he flew many trips along the West coast of Africa to Johannesburg, throughout Europe & as Far East as Bangkok, Thailand. His family & friends enjoyed the many

accounts & adventures of all of the places he traveled.

In his time away from flying he enjoyed communing with Mother Nature by way of his orchid collection & with gardening in general; plus, dabbling in stamp collecting.


