


Holiday Gathering 2019

President's Message by Francis Ferguson The Future

The picture to the left is one of four listings by a eBay seller that will blow your mind. For the princely sum of \$59.99 you can own this spectacular common stamp — and you get free shipping. This seller has been around since 2012 and seems to mostly sell clothing — the recent attempt to sell this "Vintage George Washington 1 Cent Stamp Green Old Rare" item is tilting at a windmill — to quote a phrase. There are three other listings by the eBay seller that are equally outlandish. The total of those four listings is a little north of \$600 — with the actual cash value of the four listings not even ten cents. This person obviously needs to stick to selling clothing.

- The Membership of the CFSC participates as the host and sponsor of the SUN-PEX show in June of each year. In addition, we are the resident hosting club for FLOREX, and many of the smaller local shows held in the Orlando area.
