




Zoom Meetings for September 2020

What and Why? Francis Ferguson



I am at a loss to explain this. This cover landed in my hands a couple of years ago thanks to a friend who thought I might be interested in it, because of the use of the Prexy coils. I don't collect Prexy postal history, unless there is an EFO (Error, Freak, Oddity) used. At the time I noted the extra markings but did not think any further, until recently when I was organizing my acquired material. The first thing that smacked me in the head was the obvious — why would someone send a Air Mail Special Delivery letter from Ft. Lauderdale to Miami? A distance of just over 19 miles. That does not make any sense when a simple phone call could have achieved the same objective. Using Google Earth, both the sender and receiver locations still exist, but I would

guess in a somewhat altered forms since 1952. There is no evidence of either person that I can turn up on World Wide Web. The Postage Due markings would make the rate at twenty-six cents total for the mailing. Using a resource on the WWW, the conversion of the postage amount into 2020, results in just short of \$2.60; roughly ten times corrected for inflation. The receiver location is virtually next to present day I95, however in 1952 the only north/south roads would have been 441, A1A and US1. I95



was not completed until well into the middle 1970s. This cover was sent on April 6 at 3:30pm and was received in Miami with a marking for April 6 at 7pm and a delivery strike on April 7 at 7am. If only this cover could talk — I wonder what it would say! (Does anyone have a functioning time machine?)

This bodes well for FLOREX. My Forest Lake SDA church has been holding online presentations, but they plan to have in person service on September 12. They are limiting attendance to 250 mask wearing worshipers in carefully selected seating. So, we will see. Your CFSC board will make careful plans as the time nears.
