





## Real? Or Not Real? By Jim Cooney



As a collector of the entire classical world, I love every stamp issued during or before 1940. However, if I had to pick a favorite area, it would likely be the Italian States. They are both a goldmine and a minefield – filled with gor-

geous rare stamps and a plethora of forger-

Enter the cover fragment shown here. This is part of a cover used in 1862 in Sardinia, with a bisect of 10 cent stamp used as 5 cents, to cover the cost of postage for a letter going a short distance sent by a soldier. Bisects have been used across the globe in situations where a stamp of the appropriate value is not available, for any of a variety of reasons. I do not generally collect covers, but bisects need to be so to confirm that they were actually used as such.

This particular usage is incredibly scarce, so a certificate is near mandatory!

[Editor's note: I have included a copy of the certification (above left) — of course it is in Italian. We will just have to agree with Jim that it is a good cert! Bisects are fascinating and can be found also in early United States stamp uses. Again a cert is required.]
