


Come To The Show!

On Saturday April 3rd we will hold our first local stamp bourse in nearly 14 months. The show will have 14-15 booth holders and will be held at the Maitland Civic Center (The Venue on the Lake) from 10am until 4pm. Please come out and support the dealers.

Restrictions will be in place to minimize COVID-19 exposure. Everyone at the show will be required to pass a temperature check, wear a mask correctly (at all times) and provide contact information. These requirements are not negotiable and are to be enforced to protect everyone's safety. There will be bottles of hand sanitizer around the room — and we encourage all show attendees to use the product as they see necessary. The contact information forms will be held by the show manager for 60 days and then destroyed. Everyone cleared to enter the show will be given a sticker to attach to their name badge. If you have already received the COVID-19 vaccinations you will still be required to follow the forementioned instructions. Again this is not negotiable.

There will be no food or beverage services available to the pubic at this event. Please keep that in mind when attending the show.
