



The November 17<sup>th</sup> presentation will consist of 36 slides highlighting firsts for United States stamps as determined by the Postal Commemorative Society. These firsts were highlighted in a series of cachet covers issued in 1989 and 1990. You may or may not agree with which was the first stamp(s) issued in the category. You may want to do some research on your own before the second meeting in November to see if you agree with the Postal Commemorative Society. The 36 firsts are listed on the previous page in the order that they will be presented.





## POETIC PHILATELY By Rick Cohen

How would you react if you learned that the postal rate for letters was going DOWN? Well in 1883, one gentleman, then living in Chicago, wrote a poem to express his thoughts on that very subject.

So how do I know this? I came across the item below while continuing to empty boxes and boxes of my father's philatelic accumulation.

My research juices began to flow! Who was the author? What was he telling us? Is there significance to the date shown? Do I have something of "real" value? Here's what I have learned...

Eugene Field (September 2, 1850 – November 4, 1895) was an American writer, best known for his children's poetry and humorous essays. He was born in St. Louis, MO where his boyhood home is today known as the Field House Museum.

Field's father, attorney Roswell Martin Field, was famous for his representation of Dred Scott, the slave who sued for his freedom. Field filed the complaint in the Dred Scott v Sandford case (sometimes referred to as "the lawsuit that started the Civil War") on behalf of Scott in federal court in St. Louis, whence it progressed to the U.S. Supreme Court. 
Eugene Field wrote hundreds of works. He may be best known for his poem, Wynken, Blynken and Nod. Several statues stand today in many US cities honoring Field and this poem. Numerous schools throughout

the country are named for Eugene Field. Little did I know how famous this man was! So let's get back to my philatelic "treasure." Using a search engine, I found Mr. Field's original poem of 1883, which is actually four paragraphs long. My version is but the first paragraph.

What is with the date? Well, the current rate for a ½ oz. letter was three cents at the time. However, on October 1, 1883, just six days later, the rate fell to two cents for a ½ oz. letter. Mr. Field wanted to say goodbye in a humorous way to the three-cent stamp!

So, is my piece really something he actually "signed?" The words are definitely his. I contacted Stephanie Lake, the curator at the Field House Museum and emailed her a picture of the piece. I asked her to look at the handwriting and compare to anything she has to confirm or dispel if Mr. Field wrote this himself. She replied...unfortunately, not his handwriting!

Another bust, but another interesting research project in which I learned a great deal. Still, a wonderful conversation piece of philately!



## Oh The Things You Can Learn Stamp Collecting! Bicycles on Stamps by Mike Schumacher

Bicycles have appeared on stamps since shortly after they were invented. Cuba issued the first stamp with a bicycle on it in 1899. (figure 1) (Interestingly, it contained a misspelling and was reissued three years later with the correct spelling "Inmediata" instead of "Immediata".) (figure 1a)





Since that time more than 1500 stamps have depicted all aspects of cycling (i.e. bicycle inventors; postal delivery by bicycle; road and track racing; mountain biking; touring, commuting & the Olympics, etc.).

Baron Karl von Drais of Karlsrude, Germany the inventor (figure 2) of the

**Draisienne** (also known as "laufmachine", "running machine") has

appeared on numerous stamps. Likewise, Pierre Michaux's velocipede (first mass produced bike with pedals) has appeared on numerous stamps. (figure 3) Early bicycles like the Penny-farthing also known as a "High Wheeler" & "Ordinary" have also appeared on stamps. (figure 4) Modern bicycles "Lawson's bicyclette" (now including chain drive to the rear wheel) (figures 5-6)

Bicycles have appeared on stamps for many different reasons. One of those reasons is of course - mail delivery. (figure 7) One of the most valuable bicycle stamps is the 1910 Cuban Special Delivery Mail Carrier 10-centavos stamp where the carrier is riding the bike upside down. (not shown)

Other reasons include: the Olympics and Special Olympics - which have been a favorite topic for Bicycle stamps ever since the 1952 Olympics in Helsinki. More than 400 bicycle stamps have been issued relating to the Olympic games.
