

Great American Stamp Show (GASS) 2023







Four days of philatelic fun in Cleveland, Ohio, August 10—13, 2023! Home to the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame

The Great American Stamp Show was hosted by the American Philatelic Society (APS) and the American Philatelic Research Library (APRL) joined by the American Topical Association (ATA) and the American First Day Cover Society. The partnership of these organizations indeed resulted in a fabulous philatelic experience. The APS reports that attendance was up considerably over last year. The USPS also contributed significantly in many ways to the success of the show.

The show included more than 85 dealer booths; 170 exhibits filling nearly 900 frames including the Champion of Champion competition, the Youth Champion of Champions competition, the Most Popular Exhibit Competition and Court of Honor special exhibits by the Royal Philatelic Society of London and about 60 different Literature entries ranging from articles to Journals to catalogs and handbooks; about 60 different societies and groups; eight first day of issue ceremonies; philatelic rarities including a 24 cent inverted Jenny (figure 1 on page 4) and an 1879 folded letter from George Washington weeks after he was elected the first President of the United States; (figure 2 on page 4) appearances by a number of cachet designers; Faroe Islands Postal which celebrated the first day of issue of it's 1000th stamp in it's nearly 50 years of postage stamps and the first day of issue of Martin Morck's 1000th engraved stamp; society meetings; dozens of seminars and presentations on a wide variety of philatelic topics, special show cachets and cancels, a banquet and the Luff Awards. New USPS First Day issues: On the first day of the show, the sheet of 20 new stamps was issued that explores "Life Magnified". These stamps show undetectable by the human eye aspects of life through the lens of a microscope. Cachets and FDCs for purchase were available and First Day programs were handed out to attendees.

Not to be out-done by the USPS—the Posta Faroe Islands had a First Day issue presentation of it's 1000th stamp & it was engraved by engraver Martin Morck.

Martin Morck (born 1955) was raised in a family of artists, His father was a graphic artist and a stamp collector. Martin apprenticed under Arne Wallhorn and engraved his first stamp for Sweden in 1977. The 45 ore definitive stamp depicting a tawny owl.





As a special retirement gift Svanbjorg Manai received an engraved portrait by Martin Morck.

Day two of GASS the USPS issued five new "Thinking of You" stamps at their First Day Ceremony.

Later in the day—Martin Morck and Posta Faroe Islands was at it again—this time issuing the 1000th stamp engraved by Martin Morck. The stamp also holds the record for the largest engraved stamp (honor previously held by engraver Czeslaw Slania when his 1000th engraved stamp was issued in 2000).

For his 1000th engraved stamp Martin Morck choose the 1933 painting "Retuning from Fishing" by Emil Krause. And that was just a few of the events in the first two days at GASS 2023!

Recognition for Thomas Hipshen By Stephen Patrick

I purchased some Swedish booklets from **John Bailey** at the July 20 meeting. Two of the six were engraved by **Martin Morck** who was at GASS in Cleveland, and I am brought some material for his autograph. Among the six was the Swedish booklet prepared for the *Stockholmia 86* International Philatelic Exposition. The four stamps picture a classic Swedish stamp, a stamp engraver at work, a magnified image of the 1938 Swedish-Finnish issue of the U.S. (Scott #836) and a young philatelist soaking stamps. (Figure 1)

Many of the European countries identify and honor their stamp designers, artists, and engravers on the margin of their stamps which NEVER happens in the United States. The U.S. seldom singles out its artists in this way. I was pleasantly surprised to see that **Thomas Hipshen** was honored on the Swedish stamp as a collaborator on the third stamp. (figure 2)



Thomas Hipshen started a 10 year apprenticeship at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing in 1968 and became one of their best picture engravers. Between 1973 and 1992, he engraved over 70 U.S. postage stamps including the images of Robert Kennedy, Francis Perkins, Hellen Keller, Edith Wharton, T. S. Eliot, and many others. His artistic work includes the Indian Head Penny stamp and the Numismatics issue.

Most of you are carrying an example in your wallet of his fine engraved work as he has done the portraits of Lincoln, Hamilton, Jackson, Grant, and Franklin on our U.S. currency. I've read that at age 70, he has recently retouched Franklin's portrait for the new \$100 bill coming out this year with enhanced anti-counter fitting devices.





I met Hipshen at a FUN show 20 years ago, and I am a fan of his engraving. More than six engravers worked on the 46 stamps of the Great American series of the 1980's. Hipshen did more than 17 of them, his best, in my opinion, being that of Earl Warren. (figure 3) Two pf the Great Americans were done by my favorite engraver Czeslaw Slania including that of Thomas Jefferson. (figure 4) And two were done by Martin Morek, that of Virginia Apgar (figure 5) and Alice Paul. (figure 6) **Chris Calle**, designer of Morek's two stamps and many of the Great American stamps will be at GASS too.

Alice Paul stamp issued August 18, 1995 in Mount Laurel, New Jersey. Alice Paul was an American Women suffrage leader who introduced the first equal rights amendment campaign. She wrote the "Lucretta Mott" amendment in 1923.



Questionable eBay, # 11 Really—Who would buy these? By Francis Ferguson

Would you buy this classic stamp that has been munched on? These are not minor faults – there are two major portions of the stamp missing.



Listing: RNV655 ***** SCOTT #36B, 12c WASHINGTON, c1857, USED, CV\$250, L@@K 😇 🧐. Opening bid \$7.40. Free shipping & 14-day return.

There is a rather substantial portion of this stamp missing. This is one of my favorite classic stamps, but not in this condition.



Listing: US post stamp 1922, ERROR of color, ScA161 #558, 6c orange brown instead of orange. Opening bid of \$120. Shipping from Turkey \$14 & 30-day return.

Where to begin? It is not an error. The stamp during it's time has been exposed to sulfur fumes and the orange has oxidized as a result. Extreme examples will be totally brown in color – this is a very minor example. It was offered to me for \$90. I declined.



Listing: Abraham Lincoln \$.04 Cent Stamp Purple Rare US President Excellent Condition. Open bid of \$3,000 with free shipping -- 30-day return policy.

In a rather odd turn of events, I stumbled across another dozen listings for this stamp from different sellers, ranging in price from \$5 to \$5,000. All claiming the stamp is rare. It is not rare by any stretch of the imagination.

Why this junk pollutes the philatelic eco-system is beyond me.
