


Alphabet Soup—FLOREX FFSC FSDA CFSC

You may ask what do all four of these acronyms have in common? That would be the letter 'F' – as in Florida.

The first FLOREX held in 1949 was by modern standards a non-event. It was simply a one day gathering of like-minded collectors from around the state who met with the intention of forming an organization to further the aims of philately. There was no bourse but rather a "showing" of material by those attending. As FLOREX evolved in the first decade the show moved around from Miami to Tampa and Orlando (was hosted by the CFSC in 1953). There are few solid records pertaining to those early shows. Very little has surfaced for much of the 1950s and 1960s; with only 5 show booklets being known for the first sixteen years of shows.

The first known FLOREX from 1952 is shown [Figure 1]. The last cachet from 1999 is shown [Figure 2]. See page 4

FFSC

Out of this first group of philatelic folks formed the Florida Federation of Stamp Clubs which claimed a 1949 date for its inception. The FFSC remained active and published a monthly/ quarterly newsletter from 1951 to 1997. The publication *The Florida Philatelist* archives can be found at http://CentralFloridaStampClub.org/pages/FP.files -- this repository is considered the definitive reference for the philatelic community in Central Florida. The work of processing and scanning this archive and preserving the information for future generations was supported financially by FSDA & CFSC. As the leadership of the FFSC collapsed the support for the old FLOREX also ceased – the 1999 show -- 50th year was the last sponsored by the FFSC. 

FSDA

As it became obvious in 1998 that the FFSC was going to cease to exist, a plan was presented to the FSDA BoD that would create a show to replace FLOREX. The show that resulted from that effort took place in 2000 and ultimately became the newly minted *FLOREX* – *The Florida State Stamp Show*. The leadership of the FSDA played an important and critical role in this revitalization of FLOREX.

The Florida Stamp Dealers' Association came into existence in 1960 and was formed to further the aims of professional philately in the state. The last founding member (Carl Kish) passed away in the fall of 2020. The organization is now in year sixty-three of existence and continues to be relevant in the modern era with almost 90 professional members. The FSDA entered the digital realm in the early years of the 1990s with the first dedicated website. The website now averages about two thousand hits every week, (www.FloridaStampDealers.org).

CFSC

The Central Florida Stamp Club (www.CentralFloridaStampClub.org) has archives proving the club's genesis from the middle 1940s and continuing into the modern era. There is an extraordinary depth of information on the club that can be accessed from the website. The club currently has about 90 on the active roster and continues to be a vital and active member of the Central Florida philatelic community. The club sponsors and hosts two local shows a year (February & April) and is the official hosting organization for FLOREX, providing critical staffing for the event. Without the dedication of a cadre of volunteers the show would simply not happen.

FLOREX

FLOREX (www.FLOREXStampShow.com) had a long run of years at the Expo Center in downtown Orlando and at the Central Florida Fairgrounds before moving for a short period to The Osceola Heritage Park in Kissimmee and finally landing at the Volusia County Fairgrounds. Because of constraining financial issues, the show was reduced to a two day event, while still maintaining WSP status.

FLOREX is one of only two World Series of Philately events in Florida and continues to send top winners to the Champion of Champion competition every year.

The digital footprint of FLOREX began in 2004 and continues to this day as the historical repository of show information. The width, depth and breadth of information related to FLOREX is extraordinary.

Over the decades countless individuals have played key roles in all four organizations: frequently holding administrative positions in multiple groups at the same time. While it would be easy to name some of those who are responsible for the success of the "Alphabet Soup", I would fear forgetting an individual who contributed extraordinarily of their time and talent. I will simply end with saying -- those that did great things will long be remembered in the history of the philatelic community of Florida.

The objective of all the efforts detailed in this article is to foster the hope and expectation that philately will live long and continue to prosper for generations to come (sorry for mangling the quote from Mr. Spock).

British Honduras bisects of 1888

This article focuses on the British Honduras bisect stamp Scott #28a.

The currency in the colony changed from sterling to the dollar in 1888. Stamps changed from *the penny, the pence and the shilling* to the new dollar values of *1 cent to 50 cents*.

There were no 2 cent stamps. In order to get 2 cent stamps it was best to overprint the large stock of the one penny red of 1882 (Scott #14).



Why is there a bisect?

The stamp above is a one penny stamp that has been overprinted:

2 CENTS

To make 3 cents you need a 2 cent overprint plus half of another one as seen below.



The cover appears correct but is it the proper use of the bisect stamp Scott #28a.

Catalogue values for a legitimate bisect on cover are well over \$100.00.

Let's see what kind of results we get when searching on EBay. These are complete covers but only the pertinent portions are shown here.

















Do you see the repeating name on all of these covers?

Mr. W. G. Aikman

How is that possible?

From the book "A Postal History of Belize" by E.W. King":

"William George Aikman described as a General Merchant....took a keen interest in stamps, and especially in the financial possibilities which they offered".

It goes on to state that Mr. Aikman:

"...was friendly with the then Postmaster Mr. W.F. McKinney, and in all probability with the Postal Clerk, Carl Metzgen."

"... Carl Metzgen overdid things and was subsequently convicted and dismissed for selling overprinted stamps to the Scott Stamp and Coin Company, which has not been authorized for issue."

It seems that British Honduras bisect Scott #28a is more common than first thought.

So there you have it. A rarely seen use of the bisect being exploited over a hundred years ago by an enthusiastic dealer/collector and the local postal authorities.

Questionable eBay, # 14 Two Outlandish Listings - By Francis Ferguson



Listing: 1940 US Statue of Liberty For Defense 1c Stamp Sc#899 Used Strip Of 3 - #B655, starting bid of \$3.00, shipping of \$1.00, No returns allowed.

Common as dirt. This was one of the work horse stamps of the era and was designed to promote patriotism during WWII. It is not worth five cents.

Listing: 3 CENT LIBERTY US POSTAGE STAMP - USED - PURPLE LADY STATUE OF LIBERTY, starting bid of \$12.00, free shipping, No returns allowed.

This listing is even more egregious than the previous one. This stamp was the major work-horse stamp of the series as the first-class rate during this time was three cents. If I wanted to spend the time to find the reference, I would wager the quantity printed was well into the billions.

Oddly enough some years ago, I was contacted by a person who had placed thousands of these stamps from the three different formats (sheet, coil, booklet) into a series of a couple dozen binders – and they were looking to sell this fabulous collection for \$5,000. It was not worth \$5! I declined to make the purchase or even give them a reference.


