Serendipitous Philately ---

The Notopfer Affair, by Bruce Mc Pherson

Part of the adventure of philately is the inadvertent discovery of something new and interesting related to your hobby. An example of this happened to me in 1997. As part of my German stamp collection I had accumulated a number of the little blue Berlin tax stamp known as the Notopfer. This 2 pfennig "Emergency Tax" stamp was issued to raise funds for the relief of West Berlin. Letters mailed without this stamp were returned.

A total of 20,000,000,000 Notopfer stamps were used, benefiting Berlin relief efforts by \$100,000,000. The large number of stamps issued also yielded varieties. I had developed an interest in these varieties when a note in 'Linn's' announced that a man in Canada, Mr. George Rath, was trying to organize a group of interested collectors. I had several phone conversations with George and one day in 1999 I mentioned that I had plans to visit Berlin in the next few months. George responded with the offer to contact a young friend in Berlin, advise him of my pending visit and suggest that he meet with me.

About one week later I had a phone call from Berlin. George's friend, David Geisler, requested to meet with me upon my visit. I flew to Vienna, Austria in May 1999. After spending time in Vienna I went on to

Salzburg. Then to Munich and on to Berlin by train. When I settled into my hotel room I called David. We met for breakfast and he announced that he had requested to be away from his job for the next three days so that he could show me Berlin. His father had designed the museum commemorating the Berlin Air Lift, which I attended as a VIP. I had an unexpected experience in touring Berlin with a personal knowledgeable guide. We visited the Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Tower, the Berlin Zoo, the Berlin Reichstad, the Flea Market, in addition to the Airlift Museum and the Brandenburg Gate. I was shown many interesting sites that would not be seen by the average visitor. I discovered that the gratitude felt by Berliners for Americans is very strong. The days of the Berlin Air Lift are still remembered.

This visit to Berlin also allowed me to see the Brandenburg Gate, which is also a favorite subject of a special stamp collection. I will say more about the Brandenburg Gate in subsequent columns.

Since the day of our first meeting, David has met and married an American girl. They reside in Italy and now have two children. We still correspond.
