The Board of Directors has been busy updating the Club's Bylaws that were last touched in 2001. Since then, many technologies have emerged and the bylaws needed to be refreshed to reflect those changes. A brief summary of the changes:

- ◆ The number on the board has been updated to 9 members. It was felt this number better represents the club's interests and allows for more participation from the membership and ensures a smooth transition as members retire from the board and new members are added.
- ◆ Description of the levels of membership, (Regular, Junior, Honorary) was updated and clarified.
- ◆ Membership renewal notices for the next year are distributed starting with the first meeting in November. If a member does not attend a meeting in November, a notice will be mailed to their address of record. All memberships must be renewed by the 1st meeting in January to retain membership and voting rights.
- ◆ Language was updated and better defined to handle member conduct issues that may arise.

A copy of the Bylaws will be placed on the club website in the members only section for all members to review. A copy will be placed in the new member's packet when they apply to join the club.

## Are All Stamps Created (Centered) Equal?

“Of course not!” — you answer, we all know that stamps exist with a wide variety of centering. Now, did you think that stamps from the same sheet, or even just close to each other would be centered alike? The answer to that, also is no.

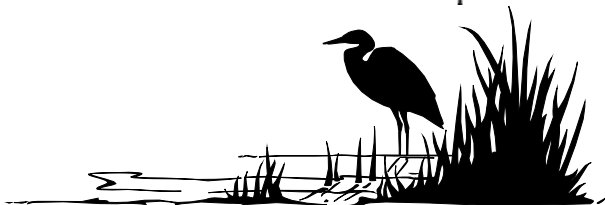
Just look at this plate block of 6 of Scott 530. The stamp in the upper left position is on the low end of very fine, its neighbor, immediately to the right just slips at fine. You get the idea and can judge the rest for yourself. There is a technical reason for this that we will leave for a later program if you are interested. We can just say that in 1918 things were measured with instruments that are crude by today's methods plus the eyesight of the production staff. All in all, a big difference from today's lasers and computer-driven production.



**The Central Florida Stamp Club** is a 70+ year old organization governed by a Board of Directors elected by the general membership every two years and dedicated to the enjoyment of the hobby of stamp collecting.
