Bill Pickett Film Shot in Florida

While on my summer travels, I visited the Florida State History Museum in Tallahassee. They currently have an exhibit of about 80 movie posters of films shot in Florida. The surprising one was *The Bull-Dogger* starring Bill Pickett the first cowboy movie star. The film was shot in Jacksonville, FL in 1921. What was eye catching is that the movie poster is the original image used for the stamp for the Legends of the West fiasco.

Pickett is billed as the “world’s colored champion.” He’s the “colored hero of the Mexican bull ring in death defying feats of courage and skill.” The

Norman studio was located in Jacksonville. Not only is the poster in the exhibition, but the Museum is using the image of Pickett for a bookmark that promotes teachers using the image for school children to write an essay “What would you write about this image?” for the program Writing Around Florida. Maybe a stamp collector should write an answer tied to the post office getting the wrong image the first time around and call it “The Rest of the Story.”
