The awards were for service to philately on the local level. The APS instituted these awards just a few years ago to give credit to members who go beyond the call of duty to assist stamp collecting. All three have served major rolls to bring FLOREX back to a national level show. Fergie and Phil went to Columbus to receive the award from Society president Wade Saadi in person at the annual meeting.



At the close of the business meeting that installed the

new APS officers, Steve Patrick delivered a \$150 check from the club to help "The Mighty Buck" campaign. Half the money was donated at the June and July meetings and the rest was matched by the board.

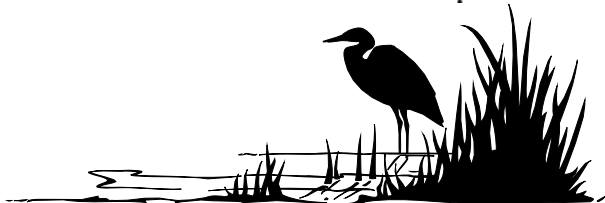
