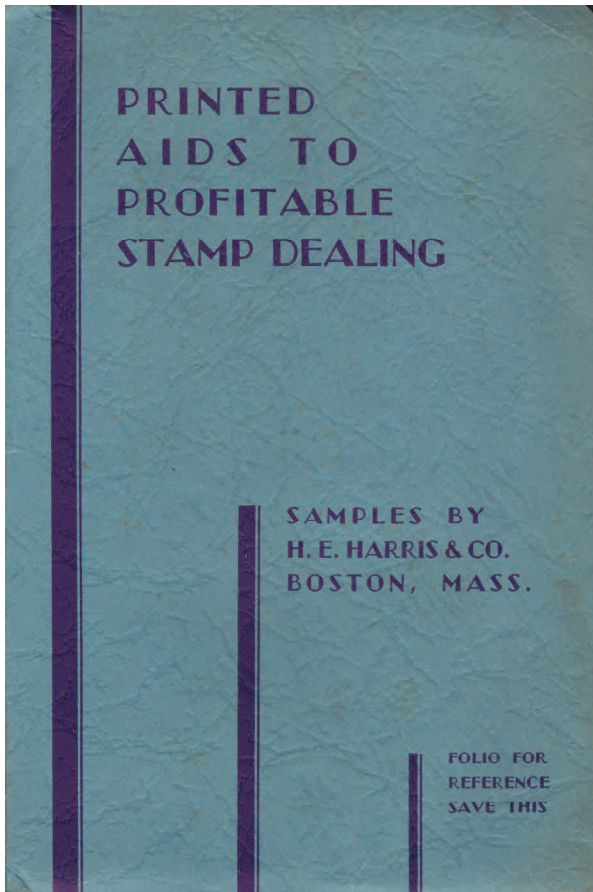

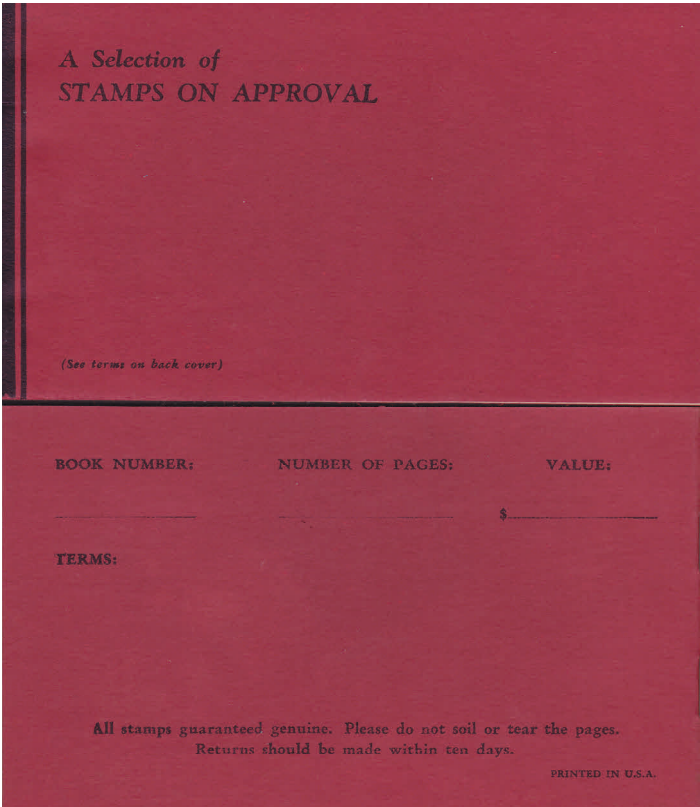

At the recent October show, I had an odd experience. As I was passing one of the ten dealer booths, I heard a noise. It sounded like my name. Closer investigation, narrowed the sound down to a coming from underneath the display glass. This scan does not do justice to what this spectacular piece actually looks like in person. To find a piece like this — all joined (no separations) with an attractive seven line circular grid cancel is like finding a pearl in an oyster. I had to own it [Scott 65 circa 1861, 3 cent, rose, printed in quantity of many millions]. Do I collect things like this? No — not really. While I have always been attracted to multiples of a stamp — especially EFO material, this is a unique item in my collection. Finding another item like this from the classic era of the U.S. may never happen again in my lifetime. Remember it has to speak to me. Thankfully this was actually a relatively low price item. If you ever found a strip of five of the higher values (up to 90 cent) in this series — you would be looking at many thousands of dollars to own.

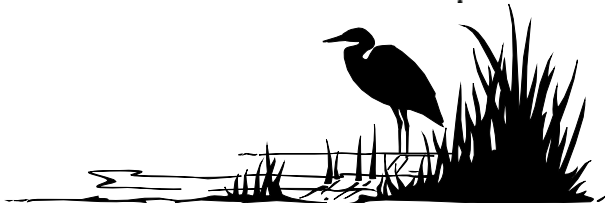
